

Additional OJDDA County Reports (19):

Baker County OJDDA Data Request 2023:

In 2023, Baker County recorded 118 unique juvenile referrals, involving 71 youth, with 38 youths facing at least one felony or Class A misdemeanor as their most serious allegation (17 felony, 22 misdemeanor, with some overlap). Three youth were committed to Oregon Youth Authority (OYA) supervision – two to probation and two to youth correctional facility (YCF) supervision – including one direct YCF commitment without prior probation, representing 1.4% of all OYA dispositions that year.

Benton County OJDDA Data Request 2023:

In 2023, Benton County recorded 139 unique juvenile referrals, involving 100 youth, with 60 youths facing at least one felony or Class A misdemeanor as their most serious allegation (20 felony, 42 misdemeanor, with some overlap). Five youth were committed to Oregon Youth Authority (OYA) supervision – two to probation and four to youth correctional facility (YCF) supervision – including one direct YCF commitment without prior probation, representing 1% of all OYA dispositions that year.

Clackamas County OJDDA Data Request 2023:

In 2023, Clackamas County recorded 738 unique juvenile referrals, involving 625 youth, with 392 youths facing at least one felony or Class A misdemeanor as their most serious allegation (152 felony, 257 misdemeanor, with some overlap). 17 youth were committed to Oregon Youth Authority (OYA) supervision – 11 to probation and seven to youth correctional facility (YCF) supervision – including four direct YCF commitments without prior probation, representing 0.6% of all OYA dispositions that year.

Curry County OJDDA Data Request 2023:

In 2023, Clackamas County recorded 99 unique juvenile referrals, involving 76 youth, with 33 youths facing at least one felony or Class A misdemeanor as their most serious allegation (eight felony, 27 misdemeanor, with some overlap). One youth was committed to Oregon Youth Authority (OYA) supervision, which was a direct YCF commitment without prior probation, representing 100% of all OYA dispositions that year.

Gilliam County OJDDA Data Request 2023:

In 2023, Gilliam County recorded 4 unique juvenile referrals, involving 4 youth, with 2 youths facing at least one felony or Class A misdemeanor as their most serious allegation (1 felony, 1 misdemeanor, with some overlap). Zero youth were committed to Oregon Youth Authority (OYA) supervision – zero to probation and zero to youth correctional facility (YCF) supervision.

Harney County OJDDA Data Request 2023:

In 2023, Harney County recorded 25 unique juvenile referrals, involving 25 youth, with 12 youths facing at least one felony or Class A misdemeanor as their most serious allegation (5 felony, 7 misdemeanor, with some overlap). One youth was committed to Oregon Youth Authority (OYA) supervision – one to probation and one to youth correctional facility (YCF) supervision – representing 0% of all OYA dispositions that year.

Hood River County OJDDA Data Request 2023:

In 2023, Hood River County recorded 71 unique juvenile referrals, involving 59 youth, with 30 youths facing at least one felony or Class A misdemeanor as their most serious allegation (9 felony, 20 misdemeanor, with some overlap). Two youth were committed to Oregon Youth Authority (OYA) supervision – one to probation and one to youth correctional facility (YCF) supervision – including one direct YCF commitments without prior probation, representing 1.7% of all OYA dispositions that year.

Jackson County OJDDA Data Request 2023:

In 2023, Jackson County recorded 736 unique juvenile referrals, involving 538 youth, with 283 youths facing at least one felony or Class A misdemeanor as their most serious allegation (159 felony, 149 misdemeanor, with some overlap). 39 youth were committed to Oregon Youth Authority (OYA) supervision – 31 to probation and 11 to youth correctional facility (YCF) supervision – including two direct YCF commitments without prior probation, representing 0.3% of all OYA dispositions that year.

Jefferson County OJDDA Data Request 2023:

In 2023, Jefferson County recorded 93 unique juvenile referrals, involving 77 youth, with 41 youths facing at least one felony or Class A misdemeanor as their most serious allegation (26 felony, 17 misdemeanor, with some overlap). Four youth were committed to Oregon Youth Authority (OYA) supervision – three to probation and one to youth correctional facility (YCF) supervision – representing 0% of all OYA dispositions that year.

Josephine County OJDDA Data Request 2023:

In 2023, Josephine County recorded 158 unique juvenile referrals, involving 120 youth, with 57 youths facing at least one felony or Class A misdemeanor as their most serious allegation (28 felony, 34 misdemeanor, with some overlap). Five youth were committed to Oregon Youth Authority (OYA) supervision – one to probation and four to youth correctional facility (YCF) supervision – including three direct YCF commitments without prior probation, representing 2.5% of all OYA dispositions that year.

Lane County OJDDA Data Request 2023:

In 2023, Lane County recorded 504 unique juvenile referrals, involving 392 youth, with 258 youths facing at least one felony or Class A misdemeanor as their most serious allegation (131 felony, 147 misdemeanor, with some overlap). 24 youth were committed to Oregon Youth Authority (OYA) supervision – 10 to probation and 15 to youth correctional facility (YCF) supervision – including 11 direct YCF commitments without prior probation, representing 2.8% of all OYA dispositions that year.

Linn County OJDDA Data Request 2023:

In 2023, Linn County recorded 353 unique juvenile referrals, involving 274 youth, with 176 youths facing at least one felony or Class A misdemeanor as their most serious allegation (91 felony, 92 misdemeanor, with some overlap). 18 youth were committed to Oregon Youth Authority (OYA) supervision – 12 to probation and seven to youth correctional facility (YCF) supervision – including three direct YCF commitments without prior probation, representing 1.1% of all OYA dispositions that year.

Marion County OJDDA Data Request 2023:

In 2023, Marion County recorded 9,457 unique juvenile referrals, involving 7,138 youth, with 4,331 youths facing at least one felony or Class A misdemeanor as their most serious allegation (2,099 felony, 2,572 misdemeanor, with some overlap). 335 youth were committed to Oregon Youth Authority (OYA) supervision – 176 to probation and 191 to youth correctional facility (YCF) supervision – including 101 direct YCF commitments without prior probation, representing 53% of all OYA dispositions that year.

Polk County OJDDA Data Request 2023:

In 2023, Polk County recorded 331 unique juvenile referrals, involving 239 youth, with 126 youths facing at least one felony or Class A misdemeanor as their most serious allegation (49 felony, 84 misdemeanor, with some overlap). 11 youth were committed to Oregon Youth Authority (OYA) supervision – two to probation and nine to youth correctional facility (YCF) supervision – including eight direct YCF commitments without prior probation, representing 3.3% of all OYA dispositions that year.

Sherman County OJDDA Data Request 2023:

In 2023, Sherman County recorded 4 unique juvenile referrals, involving 4 youth, with 4 youths facing at least one felony or Class A misdemeanor as their most serious allegation (1 felony, 3 misdemeanor, with some overlap). Zero youth were committed to Oregon Youth Authority (OYA) supervision – zero to probation and zero to youth correctional facility (YCF) supervision – representing 0% of all OYA dispositions that year.

Tillamook County OJDDA Data Request 2023:

In 2023, Tillamook County recorded 87 unique juvenile referrals, involving 74 youth, with 40 youths facing at least one felony or Class A misdemeanor as their most serious allegation (15 felony, 27 misdemeanor, with some overlap). One youth was committed to Oregon Youth Authority (OYA) supervision, which was probation.

Wasco County OJDDA Data Request 2023:

In 2023, Wasco County recorded 76 unique juvenile referrals, involving 66 youth, with 23 youths facing at least one felony or Class A misdemeanor as their most serious allegation (13 felony, 11 misdemeanor, with some overlap). 1 youth were committed to Oregon Youth Authority (OYA) supervision, which was to youth correctional facility (YCF) supervision.

Washington County OJDDA Data Request 2023:

In 2023, Washington County recorded 1,261 unique juvenile referrals, involving 991 youth, with 714 youths facing at least one felony or Class A misdemeanor as their most serious allegation (334 felony, 424 misdemeanor, with some overlap). 50 youth were committed to Oregon Youth Authority (OYA) supervision – 16 to probation and 37 to youth correctional facility (YCF) supervision – including 26 direct YCF commitments without prior probation, representing 70% of all OYA dispositions that year.

Yamhill County OJDDA Data Request 2023:

In 2023, Yamhill County recorded 259 unique juvenile referrals, involving 234 youth, with 141 youths facing at least one felony or Class A misdemeanor as their most serious allegation (56 felony, 88 misdemeanor, with some overlap). Eight youth were committed to Oregon Youth Authority (OYA) supervision – three to probation and seven to youth correctional facility (YCF) supervision – including four direct YCF commitments without prior probation, representing 1.7% of all OYA dispositions that year.
