Residential EV Credits for the Second Half of 2022

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Background

ODEQ, ODOE, and PUC receive registration data from ODOT's Division of Motor Vehicles. This data set is the official data used to track progress toward EV adoption goals and is what the Clean Fuels Program uses to calculate residential electricity credits. It is also the data that ODOE uses to populate its EV Dashboard.

Since the last credit issuance

CFP continues to use the method outlined in [Calculating Residential Electric Vehicle Credits](#) for determining the number of electric vehicles used to calculate the residential EV credits.

Results

Table 1 below shows the detailed breakdown of the revised number of electric vehicles to calculate the 2022 CFP residential credits for January through December 2022.

CFP staff will also be allocating credits to the backstop aggregator. The number of EVs allocated to the backstop aggregator for credit calculations includes the ODOT DMV data for VINs registered with out-of-state addresses, VINs registered in Oregon with no or incomplete address information, and the vehicles registered in utility service territories where the utility has not opted into the Clean Fuels Program.
