Training report: Training report for March 2022 presented by Dale Mayuiers. Marsha requested a total number of HCWs and PSWs that are currently registered. David responded by sharing the most recent numbers.

PACE Update: Information shared on latest developments. Enhanced Certification goal is for release in June. Of the seven classes for Enhanced, numbers 1, 2, 3, 5 and 7 will be offered in PACE. 4, 6 and 8 will be presented through a webinar format.

CPR/FA update: Kelly Rosenau spoke of the most recent efforts for CPR/First Aid. The roll-out of classes will occur very soon. She is currently reaching out to venues and instructors. The first class will begin on May 12th in Medford. Other locations include Gresham, Salem, and Hillsboro. Additional dates and locations will be added as scheduled. Individuals who have received an email from Kelly select the desired CPR/FA class through an Alchemer survey.

VDQ Certification: Evening classes for VDQ have been scheduled from 4:30 to 8:00 PM throughout May and June. In total, 14 sessions will be presented.

In-person training: 30 in-person training classes have been set up for the months of May and June. The maximum size for each class is 30 individuals. Status updates for the in-person classes will be shared as OHCC delivers and compiles information for all completed sessions.

Instructor RFAs: OHCC will be putting out new contracts for instructors beginning in June.

Additional questions and topics: Marsha asked, "Can a non HCW/PSW attend a Mental Health/First Aid class? And if so, how would they do so?" Roberta responded that the MH/FA classes would be free to those who attend. However, the materials (books) may need to be purchased. For those who are registered with OHCC the class, materials are free.
