Certifications report: Melanie Ewell shared the latest completions and a current status report for the various certifications. No questions or comments were offered following her presentation.

Training report: Training report for April 2022 given by Dale Mayuiers. No questions or comments were offered following his presentation.

PACE Update: Information on latest developments shared by Roberta Lilly and Dale Mayuiers. Dale noted that OHCC training registrations will be moving from the Registry to PACE on August 1st, 2022. The Registry will continue to provide all current functions for Providers and Employers.

Roberta mentioned other features of PACE: instructors will be able to view and confirm classes to be taught; a full list of classes can be viewed, and each aspect of each class can be sorted by users (this includes webinar, in-person, and Cohort courses); updates to course schedules can be made quickly and efficiently; and attendance/completion reporting will be easier to obtain.

CPR/FA update: Kelly Rosenau spoke of the most recent efforts for CPR/First Aid. Classes are being presented to Providers. The first class began on May 12th in Medford. Venues and locations are being added weekly. Other locations include

Gresham, Salem, and Hillsboro. Individuals who have received an email from Kelly select the desired CPR/FA class through an Alchemer survey.

Additional questions and topics: Marsha asked, “Is it possible to complete CPR/FA training through an online format?” Kelly responded that CPR/FA is a very “hands-on” course and is best suited for in-person training. However, a virtual version of CPR/FA is being planned using a ZOOM meeting. Attendees will use common household items for class materials.
