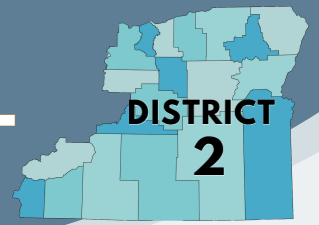

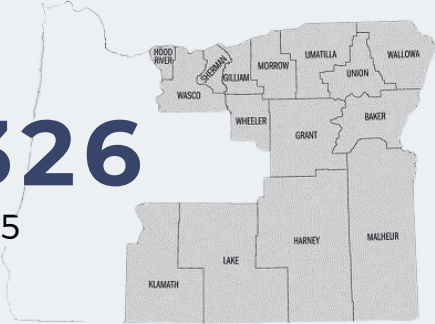
IMPROVING ACCESS TO INFORMATION
