Sandy Public Library hired a teen intern who developed valuable work skills while helping with summer reading and other library programs.



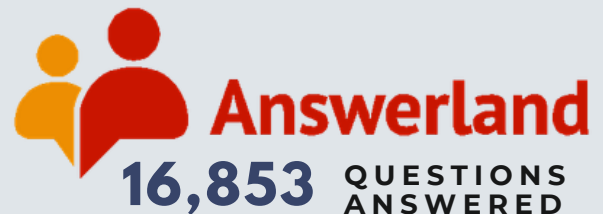
