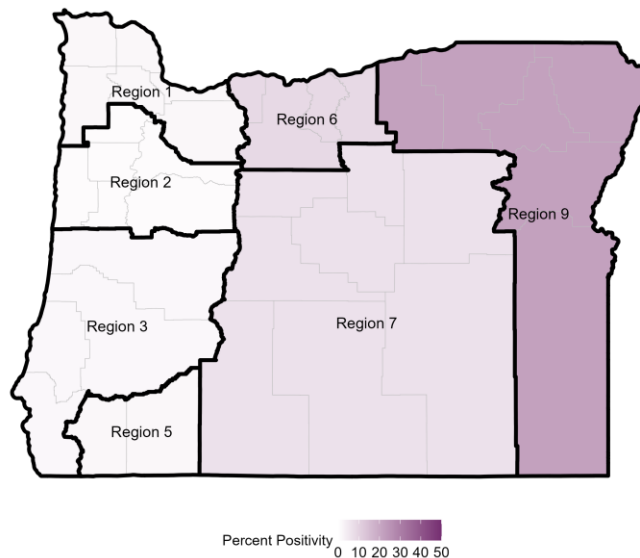

Oregon Influenza Percent Positivity by Region



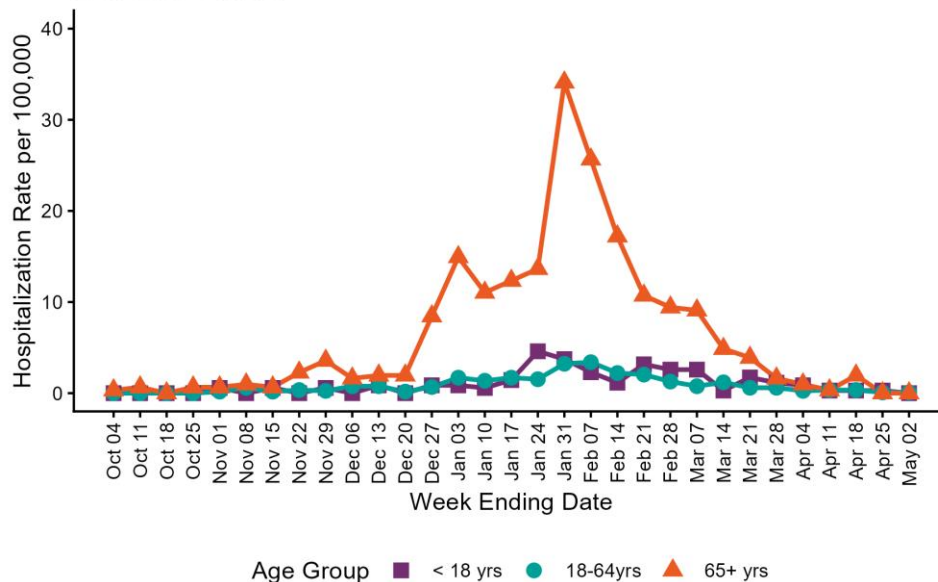

Influenza Hospitalizations

The Oregon Health Authority conducts population-based surveillance for laboratory-confirmed hospitalizations associated with influenza in Clackamas, Multnomah, and Washington counties during October 1 - April 30. To date, 1024 hospitalizations have occurred during the 2025-2026 season. There were 1 hospitalizations reported during April 26, 2026 - May 02, 2026. The cumulative hospitalization rate for the 2025-2026 season is 56.5 per 100,000 people.

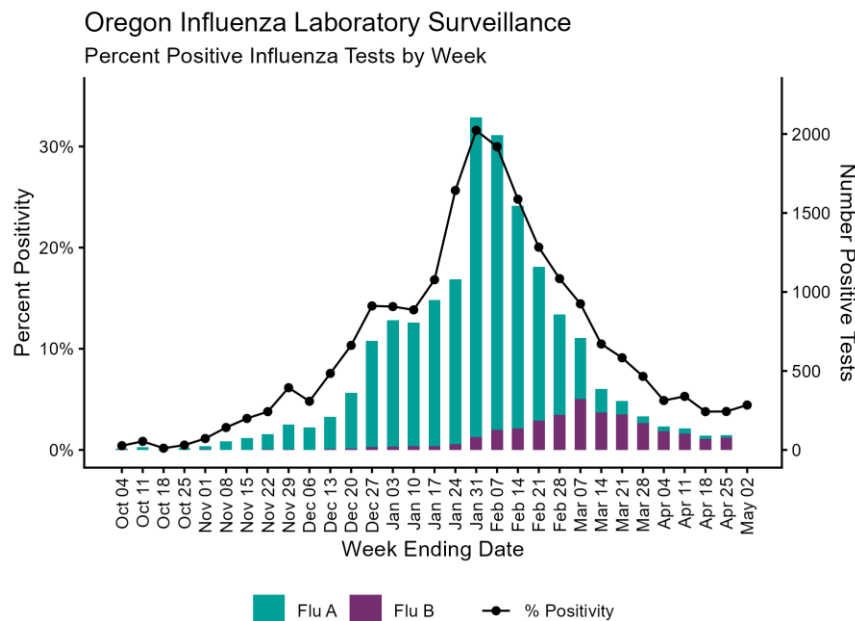
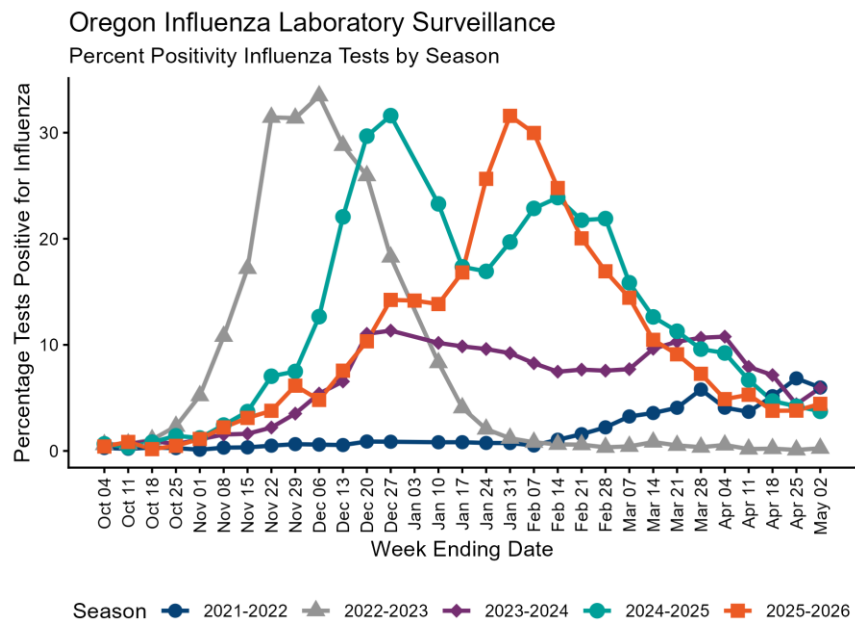

2025-2026 Season

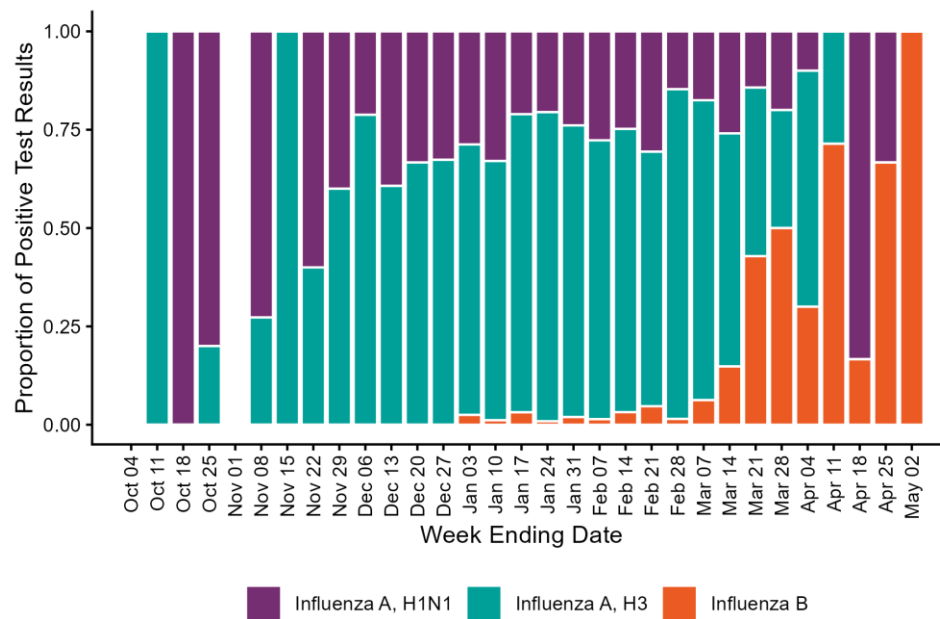


Laboratory Data

4.4% of specimens tested for influenza were positive during April 26, 2026 - May 02, 2026. 26.3% of positive influenza specimens tested at the Oregon State Public Health Laboratory (OSPHL) this season are influenza A (H1N1), 69.7% are influenza A (H3), and 4% are influenza B.
