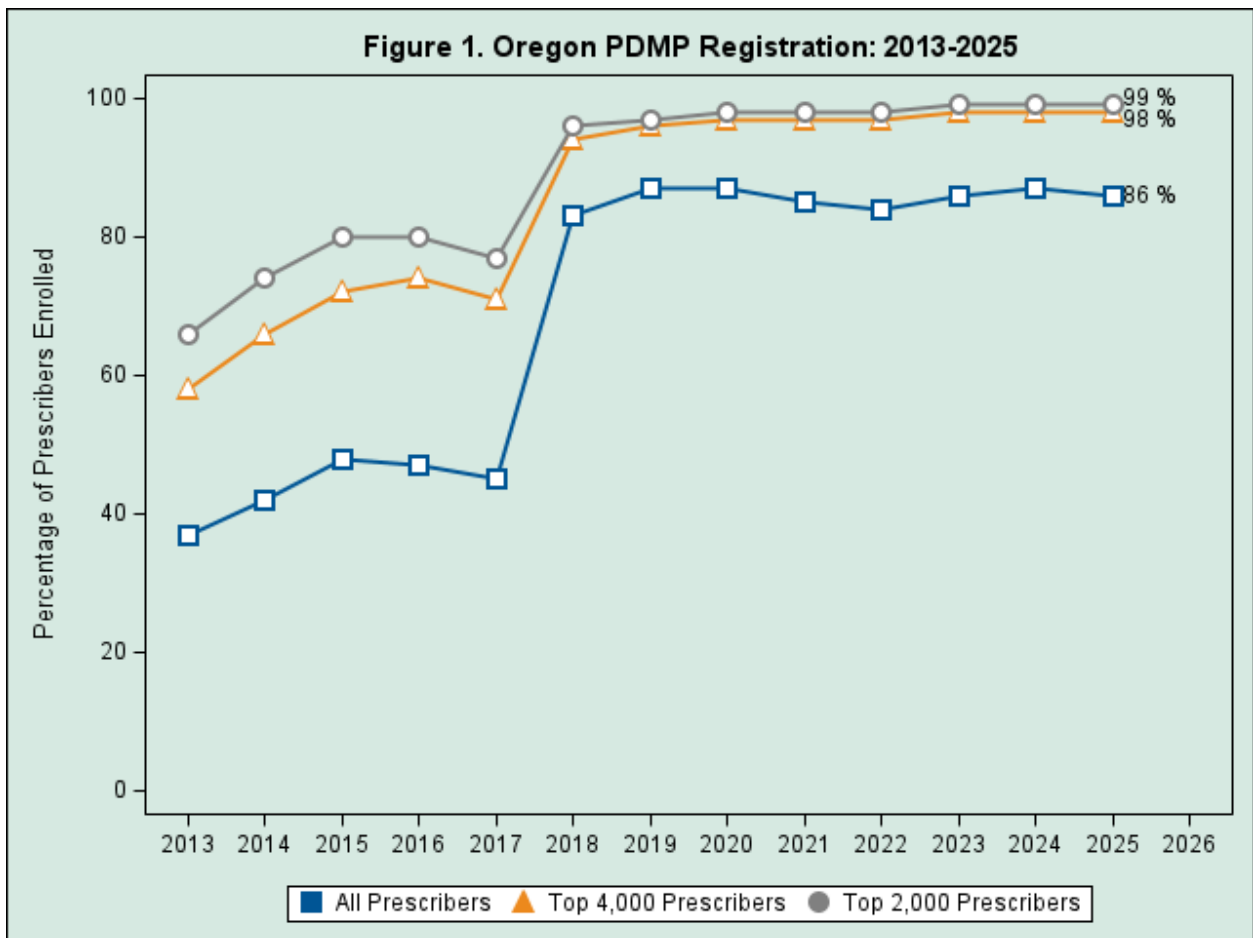


1st Quarter 2025 Report (Jan. 1 – Mar. 31, 2025)

Percent change evaluated relative to 1st Quarter 2024

Summary

- The percentage of prescribers enrolled in the PDMP system has remained consistent at around 86% for all prescribers and 98.6% for the top 2000 prescribers in Q1 2025 (Table 3 and Figure 1).
- Gateway automated queries increased overall (17.3%) while web queries decreased (-3.4%) compared to the 1st quarter of 2024 (Table 3). Integrated reports viewed decreased (-1.6%).
- As of January 2025, the Oregon PDMP now includes Schedule V drugs, as well as, veterinarian-prescribed drugs.
- Overall, the total number of prescriptions for controlled substances increased (9.4%) since the 1st quarter of 2024.
- Amphetamine is the most prescribed substance in the system with an increase (+13.0%) in prescriptions over Q1 2024. Prescriptions for the stimulant, methylphenidate, also increased 13.3% (Table 5). Pregabalin is new to our top prescribed drug list due to the inclusion of Schedule V drugs in the PDMP.
- Active facilities and active users accessing the PDMP through Gateway integration both increased in Q1 2025.



- *Figure 1* shows the number of prescribers enrolled in the PDMP over time from 2013-2025. Registration has remained consistent since 2018.

- Controlled substances were prescribed by 20,063 Oregon providers in the 1st quarter of 2025.

- At the close of the 1st quarter of 2025, 76.6% of enrolled prescribers, 91.4% of the top 4,000 prescribers, and 92.5% of the top 2,000 prescribers queried using the web portal and/or gateway integration.
- The percentage of enrolled prescribers who query the system has slightly decreased since the 1st quarter of 2024 when 77.3% of enrolled prescribers submitted queries.

- 51 special requests were received and processed by PDMP staff.
- Healthcare boards were the most frequent originators of these requests.

Queries de-duplicated using last name, date of birth, prescriber ID, and date of query.

- Web portal queries have decreased -3.4% from the same quarter last year across most user groups, with the largest decrease in pharmacy queries.
- Automated queries increased 17.3% over the same quarter last year. Integrated reports viewed has slightly decreased (-1.6%), indicating that the increase in automated queries did not result in more providers viewing patient records.

- *Table 4* represents usage for only Oregon providers who are registered with the PDMP.
- User accounts in most disciplines increased this quarter, with delegates accounts increasing the most (up 14.3%).
- In general, most disciplines are increasing usage of the integrated system and decreasing usage of the PDMP through the web portal.

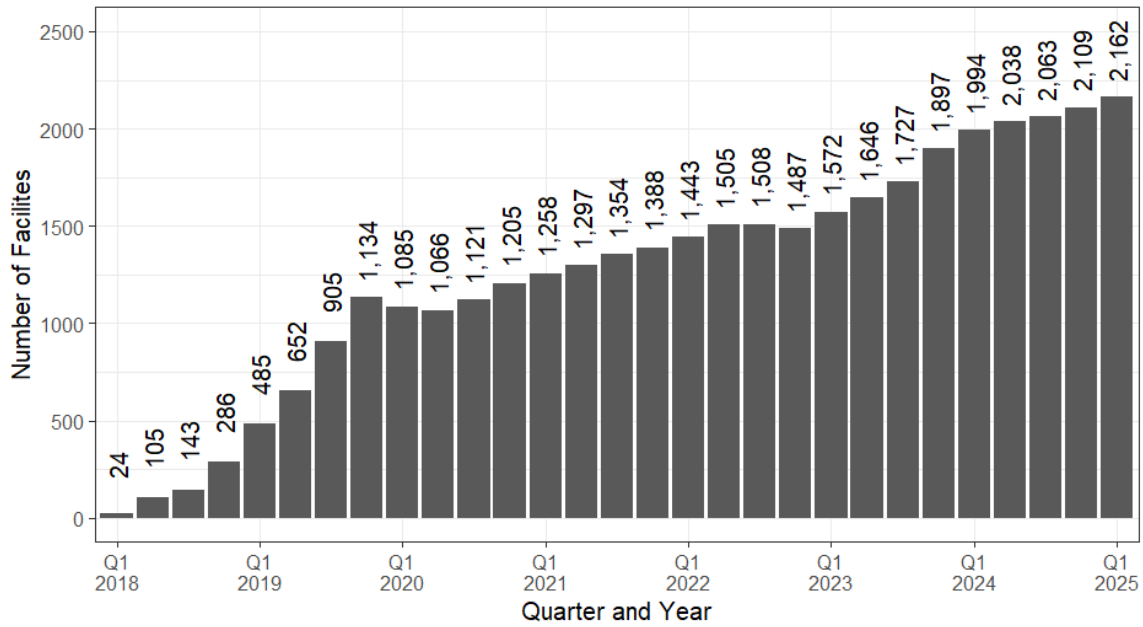

- As of January 2025, the Oregon PDMP now includes Schedule V drugs, as well as veterinarian-prescribed drugs.
- Overall, controlled substance prescriptions have increased 9.1% over the same quarter last year.
- Amphetamine is the top prescribed drug in the PDMP (13.4% of all prescriptions). Prescriptions for amphetamine increased 13.0% over the same quarter last year. The stimulant, methylphenidate also increased 13.3%.
- Prescriptions for gabapentin, oxycodone, and hydrocodone all slightly decreased during this time (-0.3%, -0.1%, and -6.9%, respectively).
- Pregabalin is a schedule V drug and is new the PDMP this quarter.

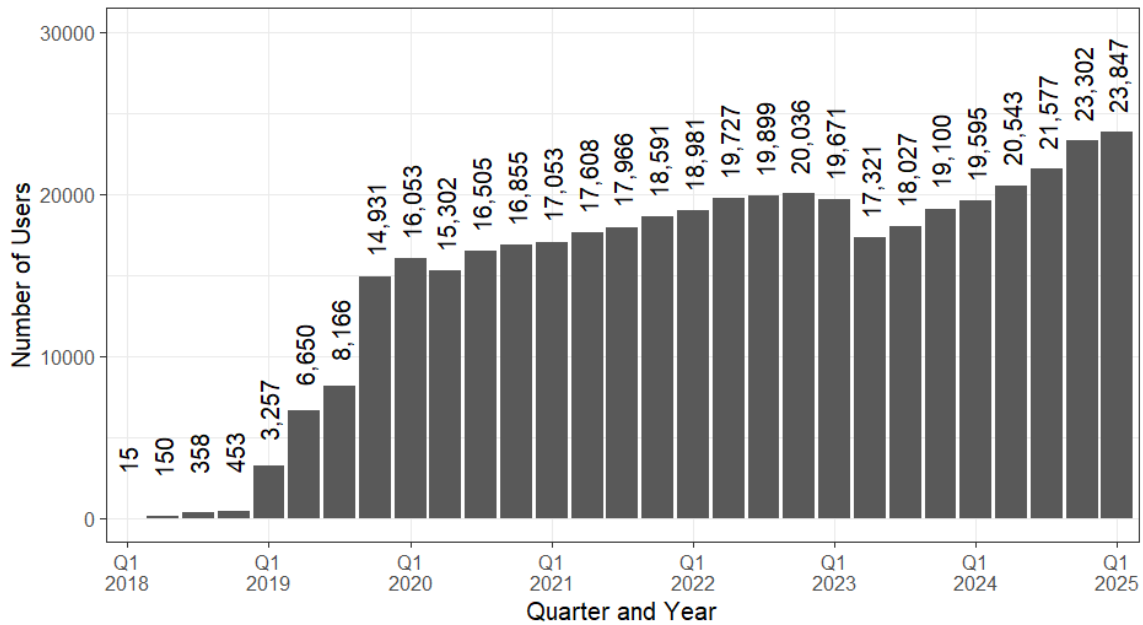
Figure 2. Active facilities accessing Gateway integration: 2018-2025

To better understand users and facilities accessing Gateway, *Figure 2* and *Figure 3* show usage over time.

- Active facilities continue to steadily increase with 2,162 current active Oregon facilities in Q1 2025.
