This guide was created to help Oregon fire agencies complete Oregon's NERIS+ form within the state's repository. This job aid guides users through incident/event entry by module, panel, and data field.

When reviewing the available modules, panels, and data fields, please note that **all features may not be visible at all times**. Many panels and data fields are conditionally required or optional and may remain hidden until specific criteria are met.

Future national and state-level additions or revisions made after Jan. 1, 2026, to the Oregon Official NERIS+ Form may not be reflected in this document. The NERIS+ Field Guide will be reviewed and updated on an annual basis to ensure it remains applicable to the national and state data schemas.

| NERIS Incident ID         | Unique identifier in NERIS for the incident. Combination of NERIS ID, Entity Incident ID, and Epoch time conversation of call create time. This will be hard coded as read only and auto populated by NERIS in the future.                                                                                                                                                |
| Incident Number           | This is an agency determined incident number. If Dispatch Incident Number was entered this should auto-populate. If the dispatch incident number is not entered, i.e. agency doesn't use CAD integration, then this number must be entered. Unlike NFIRS, this isn't limited to 7 characters.                                                                             |
| Secondary Incident Number | This is an optional agency-identified incident number. | Primary Incident Type     | Each event must have, at minimum, a primary incident type. | Additional Incident Types | Agencies can enter a total of 3 incident types. The menu/book button works the same as the primary incident type.
